

## Face many lions before facing the giant

Growing in faith is one of the many spiritual growth aspects Bible is dealing with. Today churches, communities and individuals desire to see the mighty move of God. Considerable effort has been taken in this direction. Churches are deeply involved in organizing seminars, bible study, crusades, fasting prayers, prayer drives, prayer cells, outreaches, prison ministries, hospital ministries, distributing flyers, caring for the starving, widows and orphans, etc. Even though millions get benefited by these ministries, how many really receive the salvation of Christ Jesus and get ready for the eternal life is in question. How much ever the churches are advancing with passion and zeal for the Lord, so much so the devil is in action knowing that his time is short. The devil is advancing his kingdom by occupying the mind, body and soul of the young and old by the cares and pleasures of this world. According to Matthew 12:29, *how can one enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he first bind the strong man?* Is it not true that, more than these ministries, God is looking for men and women who can face the devil, fight with him till he loses his strength and bind him so that these ministries will be effective and souls can be added to the kingdom of God.

In Mathew chapter 17, when a man brought his son who was a lunatic to the disciples, they could not cure him. Jesus was calling them “O faithless and perverse generation”. When the disciples asked Jesus the reason for their inability to heal the son, Jesus said that it was because of their unbelief. Then Jesus made an analogy with mustard seed and mountain to reveal the power of such great faith even though it is little in size. Today huge effort and money are spent in ministries, but still people are disappointed, again and again being pushed into the sinful life, the same deadly disease and the same old issue they have been dealing with for a long time. People are ministered and Gospel is presented, the missing element is the little faith that can move the mountain. Faith can pull down the strong holds, the principalities, powers and the rulers of the darkness of this world. Only such a fight in faith can make the enemy weak and allow the people to seek the kingdom of God and His righteousness. Every minister of God has to face such a challenge in their lives. It all matters what level of faith one has. Do you have no faith like the disciples? Do you have the little faith that can move the mountains? Do you have enough faith to face the lions? Do you have enough faith to face the giants? This article “Face many lions before facing the giant” will enable you to grow in faith irrespective of the faith level you are in now. The story of David and Goliath is an example of growing faith in the life of David. David was at the peak of his faith when he faced the giant. But this faith didn't come all of a sudden. It is appropriate to understand what prepared David to face such a challenge with boldness. [1] David was the youngest of the eight sons of Jesse. The family lived in Bethlehem, a few miles south of Jerusalem. David took care of his father's sheep in the pasture fields around Bethlehem. Sometimes wild animals would try to steal and eat the young lambs. David was strong and brave and fought the wild animals to rescue the sheep. Once he killed a lion who was stealing a sheep. Another time he killed a bear that was carrying away a lamb. Living in the fields with the animals in his care had made David strong and fearless.

### Know the Lord in whom we trust

According to I Samuel 3:7, Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, neither was the word of the LORD yet revealed unto him. [2] The system could not bring Samuel to know the Lord because the priests themselves did not know him. What an awesome thought! Knowing the mighty things God has done in the past kindles faith within us. Knowing who He was helps us to know who He is. How strong our faith depends on how deep we know Him. [3] According to Dr. Dale A. Robbins, Great faith begins as a follower of Christ, knowing him personally, realizing his divine authority. Growing in faith requires continuous growth in the knowledge of knowing the Father, Son Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Apostle Paul, even though he was a Bible scholar, knew the importance of knowing Him more and more. Without any hesitation he declares in Philippians 3:10 that I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death.

The ultimate source to know about God is the Bible. Bible describes how God revealed Himself to mankind over the ages. Knowing the Word of God reveals us who God is. That revelation of God results in faith. Romans 10:17 *So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.* Allowing the Word to work in us springs forth greater amount of faith. Word of God has potential to develop faith in us as a seed has ability to germinate. Whenever a situation puts us down, Word of God provides faith that lifts us up. The faith essential to build our life in Christ is in God's Word. For example, one may be able to believe the existence of God, but not able to believe the creation of heaven and earth. Reading Genesis Chapter 1 over and over again will bring great faith in God's creation. It may be hard to believe that God is our Provider, but when we read that Elijah

was fed by ravens we start seeing beyond the human possibilities. Reading the Word of God and allowing it to work within us increases our faith level.

In the life of David, he knew the Lord even when he was tending his sheep in the wilderness. His knowledge and faith in the living God was honored when Samuel called David to anoint him. More than that the Spirit of the Lord came upon David in 1 Samuel 16:13 *Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the Spirit of the LORD came upon David from that day forward.* Moment David realized that the anointing of the Lord is upon him, he started ministering Saul when Saul was tormented by the evil spirit. 1 Samuel 16:23 *And it came to pass, when the evil spirit from God was upon Saul, that David took an harp, and played with his hand: so Saul was refreshed, and was well, and the evil spirit departed from him.* He knew the anointing resting upon his life. David was very certain that what will happen when he calls upon the name of the living God. In 1 Samuel 17:45 *David said to Goliath Thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom thou hast defied.* I am sure David would have already experience the power in the name of the Lord when he killed the lion and the bear. Such a deep knowledge about the name of the Lord triggered such a great faith within David that made possible the human impossibilities.

## Allow and be willing to face challenges

Facing challenge is a good means of measuring our faith. When we are exposed to situations that are challenging we tend to depend on God. The level of dependency is related to the measure of our faith. How we handle the challenge gives an idea about our faith. Successfully handling small challenges will increase our faith and equip us to face bigger challenges. The bottom line is, are we willing to face challenges or trying to run away from challenges?

### Always be prepared

God can use any person who is available for Him at any time. Many are willing to do great things for the Lord but they are not available when God wants to use them. Today the whole world is very busy and we God's children are trying to be in pace with the world in order to handle the challenges for our daily living. But how many of us are prepared to take up the challenge that is caused by the heavenly calling. The challenge for young David on that day was to leave the sheep with the keeper and to know the whereabouts of his brothers. He would not have realized that there is another challenge more demanding than what was given by his father will be assigned by the Heavenly Father. David would not have faced that unless he was prepared. At times of threat, government orders its troops to be ready to face any challenge in a short notice. If such a great deal of alertness and preparation is required for an earthly challenge, how much more is required to execute the heavenly challenges on earth.

### Many are challenged, but only few are ready to face it

Goliath made the challenge that was common for everyone who listened to him that day. He said, "Choose you a man for you, and let him come down to me. If he be able to fight with me, and to kill me, then will we be your servants: but if I prevail against him, and

kill him, then shall ye be our servants, and serve us.” Even though many were challenged, only one was willing to accept and respond to the challenge. Today in the life of a child of God, these types of challenges come in different flavors. It may be poor health, poverty, opposition, persecution, attack of the enemy, etc. Many refuse to face these challenges and walk away from the Lord. Very few face the challenges with boldness and dare to enjoy walking with the Lord in the midst of troubles. There were armies of Israel kept prepared to face this challenge, but none of them were willing to face it. But David, an individual looked at the opportunity not looking at the consequences. Many wait upon the Lord in fasting and prayer for Him to handle the challenge forgetting the fact that God is looking for them to arise, march towards and face the challenge like David did.

#### Facing challenge is an option

David could have easily ignored the challenge of the Philistine like the rest of the army. No one forced David to go and fight against Goliath. He knew the timing of God and took the challenge whole heartedly. Even today facing challenge is an option given to the children of God. It is you and me to decide to face it or not. Many who committed their lives to do great things for the Lord eventually became ineffective and face spiritual burnout. If we analyze the reason for such a fall we can easily find that they failed to accept the challenges for God at some point of time. Our God is very gentle; He doesn't force anyone to accept any challenge. Look at what He says in Luke 9:23 *And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me.* He doesn't say that all of you should follow Him. He says “*If any man*”. It is an option given to anyone who would like to follow Jesus. The challenge may be anything that God would like us to do. It may be keeping an hour for prayer every day or can be a call from God to fight against Goliath. There may be different challenges in front of us. It all matters how we react to the call of God. We can say no to God and continue to live in our own way or we can accept the call to face the challenge. What makes the difference is the day when we stand before the Lord. We are not given an option on that day. The Lord appears there with an option of either keeping us on the left or right hand side. Matthew 25: 31 *When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory: 32 And before him shall be gathered all nations: and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats: 33 And he shall set the sheep on his right hand, but the goats on the left. 34 Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: 41 Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels:*

### **Realize the need to exercise your faith**

#### You are appointed here for a heavenly purpose

According to Genesis 1:25, God gave the earth to man to have dominion over every other creature. But very soon the devil took control over man and started ruling the earth as a wicked ruler. In John 14:30 Jesus says he is the prince of this world. I John 5:19 says the whole world lieth in wickedness. God lost the direct access to this world until the ruler of this earth is bound and thrown into the eternal fire. God had to depend on man to perform

His work in this world. That is the reason God called Noah, Moses, Joshua and many other Kings and Prophets. Even today God is looking for a man to stand in the gap, Ezekiel 22:30. Many may question, why there are earthquakes, hurricanes, tsunamis, famine and other disasters? Does God close his eyes? God doesn't punish His children by killing them, if so the sacrifice on the cross is in vain. Even today God protects His people when they call upon His name. Someone said like this, when His children call upon His name, God the Father remembers the sacrifice His son Jesus did on the cross and answers immediately. The point I am trying to drive here is that God needs you and me to fulfill His will on this earth. In other words, our existence on this earth is not just accidental, it is appointed by our Heavenly Father.

It is amazing to know how God appoints His children for His purposes.

- Jeremiah says in Jeremiah 1:5, *Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations.*
- Mordecai telling about Esther in Esther 4:14, *who knoweth whether thou art come to the kingdom for such a time as this?*
- David meeting Goliath in 1 Samuel 17:23 *And as he talked with his brothers, behold, there came up the champion, the Philistine of Gath, Goliath by name, out of the armies of the Philistines, and spake according to the same words: and David heard them.*

We can add many more from the Bible who were appointed in specific situation, in a specific time for a specific purpose. God has appointed you and me in this planet earth for a specific purpose. Knowing that God has a plan for each one of us definitely motivates and increases our faith. David would not have realized the purpose when he killed the lion and the bear. But when he heard the giant defying the name of the Lord, I am sure he would have related to the previous victories and realized that God has brought him with a purpose.

#### Know that it is your time

We often get reminded of a quote by C.T. Studd "Only one life, it will soon be past; Only what's done for Christ will last." When David heard the voice of Goliath, not only he realized that God has brought him to the war field with a purpose; also he realized that it is his time to respond to the challenge. He knew how important it is to kill the lion and the bear the moment he found them. If not, he would have lost his sheep and the price is heavy. When he heard the voice of Goliath, even though it is an impossible task for a human to handle, he was certain that it is an opportunity that cannot be missed. He knew that it is not the time to sit and relax or even go back to his routine work. He knew that it is the time of God and taking care of his own family, job, health, and even life will not help him to achieve what God has purposed in his life. I am sure the Heaven would have looked at David; the angelic hosts would have cheered him up and God the Father would have nodded His head to show his agreement and got up from the throne of grace to see the battle that is an act of faith.

Your decision fulfills God's purpose on earth

There are times in our Christian walk we need to exercise our faith. Exercising our faith is nothing but visualizing the unseen that we hope for and moving forward. These steps we take in faith make a huge difference in our lives and in other lives too. Many miracles happen because of a step of faith, many ministries are born because of a step of faith and obedience, many lives are changed because of a step of faith someone took at some point of time. These decisions or the step of faith we take fulfill God's purposes on this earth. The decision to fight was the step David took on that day for the miraculous defeat of Philistine. A quote says "Opportunities are never lost; someone will take the one you miss." At times we think Our God is a God of second chance. But the truth is that when God wants to do certain things through us in a specific time and if we are not available for Him, He gets that done by someone else as God's work cannot be delayed. God might give us a second chance with another purpose that we might be able to fulfill without failing Him again, but the truth is that we failed to fulfill the original purpose that God planned for us.

**Realize your inability to face the challenge in carnal means**Know the force behind the challenges

Goliath is not an ordinary person. Bible describes about Goliath and how well he was prepared for the battle in 1 Samuel 17:4-7. *4. And there went out a champion out of the camp of the Philistines, named Goliath, of Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span. 5. And he had an helmet of brass upon his head, and he was armed with a coat of mail; and the weight of the coat was five thousand shekels of brass. 6. And he had greaves of brass upon his legs, and a target of brass between his shoulders. 7. And the staff of his spear was like a weaver's beam; and his spear's head weighed six hundred shekels of iron: and one bearing a shield went before him.*

Just to get an idea,

Goliath height = six cubits and a span= 9 feet and 9 inches

Goliath's coat = five thousand shekels of brass = approximately 156 pound

David realized who is standing in front of him. At times in our Christian walk we fail to realize with whom we are fighting against. There is an infant stage in Christian life when we fight against flesh and blood. But when we grow up our fight is no more with flesh and blood. Bible clearly tells that in Ephesians 6:12 *For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places.* As our fight is directly with the devil and his demonic forces, we should know who he is and how strong he is. Today there are many evil forces prevent people coming into the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Countries are having their own problem of violence, sex, alcoholism, etc. In addition to these, there are other evil forces enter in the form of idol worship, meditation, yoga, counseling, etc. Knowing that he has a limited time in this world, the devil is trying to spread his wickedness with great thrust. As children of God we need to identify his means of spreading the wickedness and fight against to prevent it from taking root in our community.

Understand your limitations

Unless we understand our limitation, we fail to estimate the strength of the enemy. Under estimating the strength of the enemy will leave us unprepared for the battle. Our limitation is critical for the spiritual warfare as our fight is with the devil. He has more than 6000 years of experience wrestling with the children of God. We cannot ignore our limitations while dealing with this old serpent. More than we know, he knows our limitations. With his tricks he deceived many to fall from the grace. John 8:44 Talks about who he is. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it. Because of this nature, it is difficult to find out his move and to cancel his plans. If we are not aware of our weakness, he tries to enter in through those weaknesses and removes our title as child of God. Dealing with the devil requires adequate preparation and strength of God. Many try to do this and get defeated. Once, a man of God went to pray for a girl possessed with an evil spirit. The moment he started praying and commanding the evil spirit to leave, the spirit started talking to the man. It started describing the secret life of this man that is not seen by others. As this was observed by many gathered around, this poor man had to leave that place with disappointment.

As the fisher men were washing their nets before they go for next round of fishing Luke 5:2, every believer has to sit at God's presence every day to analyze their lives to find any unclean wicked nature hanging around. Unless we do this, we may not realize who we are, but the enemy will easily identify and overcome. Sitting at his feet is one way to realize who we are. The other important aspect is to analyze our lives in the light of the Word of God. Word of God is like a mirror used to see our face. If our lives are not in line with the Word of God, devil will easily identify and overcome. Our spiritual life is so fragile and can easily get messed up if we fail to realize who we are and seek God's help accordingly.

Realize the need of total dependency on God

Only those who realize their limitation and feel the need of having a divine protection from the enemy seeks help from God. When we realize the need of having God's protection, God covers us with the Word of God and the anointing of the Holy Spirit. When we depend on God, He gives us the whole armor of God that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand, Ephesians 6:13-18. *14. Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; 15. And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16. Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked. 17. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God: 18. Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints.*

The important aspect here is that we need to depend on Him. As long as a branch stay connected with the plant, there is life. The moment it is cut off, it withers away. Enemy cannot overcome as long as we stay connected to the living water. No storm can shake us as long as we built our house on the rock. Enemy trembles seeing a life that is strongly

rooted on the Word of God. Such a dependency on God is required in order to face many giants of this world.

## Use your past victories to gain experience

### Remember it is not new to you

Unlike his brothers, David did not have much experience in fighting. David was the youngest of all and he was sent to feed the sheep by his father Jesse. When David wanted to fight against the Philistine, Saul discouraged David saying you will not be able to go against this Philistine to fight with him: for you are a youth, and Goliath a man of war from his youth. David did not give up hearing Saul. He was trying to convince Saul by telling his little experiences of killing a lion and a bear. The experience may or may not be relevant, but the outcome was a success. He could relate to his past successes and take courage to face the current situation. We know the saying “Failures are the stepping stones to success”. Here in the case of David we could say that, past successes are the stepping stones to current and future success.

Today God wants many Davids to work in His vineyard. Every little experience in our spiritual walk counts. David had to go behind the sheep into the wilderness to gain the experience of killing the lion and the bear. God takes us through different phases of life that include visiting different places, meeting different people, encountering obstacles, developing strategies to overcome, being part of churches, fellowships, ministries, etc. In every phase we gain experience and the successes we experience develop great amount of faith within us. Our God remembers each and every step of faith we take for Him. At some point of time He expects us to face challenges for Him. Like David, we should be able to remember our past experiences and be willing to accept the challenge that is entrusted to us.

David got this experience in the wilderness while tending his sheep. Moses got this experience while growing in the Egyptian palace and tending his sheep in the wilderness. Today irrespective of the age, God uses young and old in His Kingdom. As said by the prophet Joel in Joel 2:28, 29 God is pouring out His spirit upon all flesh. God is willing to anoint you and me and use the little experience we have in the past to exploit great things for the Lord in the present and in future. God is not looking for well qualified and experienced individuals; He is looking for someone who is willing to take advantage of the little experience gained in the past.

### Your trust is in God

Look at the words of David in 1 Samuel 17 : 45 *Then said David to the Philistine, Thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom thou hast defied.* David had a great trust in the name of the Lord. Remembering what God did when he put his trust in the name of the Lord, David sings in Psalm 20:7,8 *Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God. They are brought down and fallen: but we are risen, and stand upright.* Even though David had the experience of killing the lion and the bear, he says I don't simply rely on my experiences; I go against this Philistine in the name of the Lord, in whom I trust.

Experiences are essential but in whom we trust is very important as written in 1 John 5:4 *For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith.* I remember the words of Pastor. Dudley Thangiah who is a senior pastor of the biggest church in the city of Madurai, India. He says, “I prepare well before going for preaching. I spend minimum 6 to 8 hours in prayer and reading the Word of God. But while walking towards the podium to preach, I tell the Lord, it is not my experience, not my prayer, not my meditation, it is you and your grace alone can help me to preach.” How true it is. This is what David did to bring down Goliath. He put so much trust in the Lord and says in Psalm 21:7 *For the king trusteth in the LORD, and through the mercy of the most High he shall not be moved.*

## Establish God’s kingdom once the battle is won

### Destroy the enemy and possess the land

Why did the children of Israel fight against the Philistines? Why David killed Goliath? Why do we see always the children of Israel fighting against the people in the land? All these fight is to possess the land and establish God’s kingdom. Only when God’s kingdom is established, people turn to the Lord and start worshipping Him. If God’s children keep quiet, Satan establishes his kingdom and people are led into wickedness and the wrath of God destroys the land. All the battle the children of Israel performed in the Old Testament is a shadow of the battle happening in the spiritual realm in the current age. As children of God we need to fight against the principalities, the powers, the rulers of the darkness of this world and the spiritual wickedness in high places. This is a spiritual warfare. This warfare is to fight against the devil and his army. As it is said in Matthew 12:29 this is a spiritual battle to bind the strong man and plunder the lives he keeps as captive.

Our enemy is not people, religion or organization. Our enemy is the fallen angel, the devil. He enters into the land in many forms today. He enters into countries in the form of culture, tradition, social service, false doctrine, etc. His entry needs to be prevented. If not, he will establish his kingdom in the form of religion, organization and culture. Slowly we can realize darkness covering the nation, increase in wicked acts, reduction in the number of people worshipping the living God as people get easily attracted towards the wickedness, eventually people will be turned to worshipers of satan. Why there are satanic churches all around the world? There is no doubt that children of God failed to destroy such powers of darkness entering into the land.

In these last days God is raising His army to fight against the evil spirits attacking the people and drifting them away from God. A great awakening is felt among churches to fast and pray for the revival among churches. When God’s children gather together in oneness of mind and pray, the devil loses his strength and it becomes easy to release people from the bondage of sin.

### Protect the land and don’t allow the enemy again

It is the responsibility of the church to protect the victory that is already won. What Jesus said to the multitudes in Matthew 12 is applicable to an individual and to the church as

well. Matthew 12: 43-45 43. *When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest, and findeth none.* 44. *Then he saith, I will return into my house from whence I came out; and when he is come, he findeth it empty, swept, and garnished.* 45. *Then goeth he, and taketh with himself seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first. Even so shall it be also unto this wicked generation.* It is the responsibility of the church to stand in the gap and ensure that the enemy doesn't enter again.

As children of God having concern over the land needs to be aware in what ways the devil can steal the victory once won. Following are some form of entry the devil has established to enter into the land and destroy the people.

- Establishing temples for Idol worship
- New age movement (man is god)
- Guruism (worshipping so called saints)
- Transcendental meditation
- Yoga (occult)
- Demonic practices (astrology, palmistry, spiritism -communicating with dead people, Black magic)
- Education system (Introducing other religion concepts in schools through yoga, meditation, and in syllabus)
- Replication of social action (building children homes, hospitals and institutions as foreign missionaries did in under developed countries)
- False teachings and cults (Jehovah witness, Methodical Mormons, etc.)
- Sociable strongholds (gays, bisexual, lesbians, trans gender, abortion, addiction, clubs, )

These are the Philistines and Goliaths of these days against whom the church has to battle. When the above practices are among the people of the land, God cannot bless the land. Bible says in 1 Peter 3:12 *For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil.*

#### Establish and move on

We need to identify the spiritual giants the nation is facing today and fight against them until the battle is won. Once the battle is won and the land is possessed, establish God's kingdom in the land. This happens by building churches, establishing prayer groups, rising up local leaders to take care of the people in the land. Once our job is done, we need to move forward to face the next challenge. Paul says in 2 Corinthians 10:4 *For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds.* God is equipping the church today to handle the spiritual weapons. He is giving opportunities to kill lions today, thus preparing the church to face the giants tomorrow.
